The Feinstein Challenge Helps the Oak Park River Forest Food Pantry's Light Shine Brighter

Andrew, a Wednesday afternoon client remarked: "Economy is bad. I've been injured and on SSI. Any help that this agency has, food, and their extra care is what we people need - to get some hope that there may be a light at the end of the tunnel. Thank you."

Suburban poverty is growing at an alarming rate. Cities and suburbs in the Midwest in particular have experienced the largest poverty rate increase over the past decade (Brookings Institution, 2010). As a result an **unprecedented number of families in the United States—including our community—are seeking food from emergency food programs.** With the protracted recession and continued double-digit unemployment, many people find their resources exhausted and at a loss for what to do. At the Oak Park River Forest Food Pantry, we are honored to help neighbors like Andrew in their time of need.

More than 40,000 local people received emergency food from the Oak Park River Forest Food Pantry in 2009–63% more than the previous year. All 40,000 people were provided with food because the community of Oak Park and River Forest is responsive to the need. Each family received an allotment of food similar to what is pictured below.
